On July 25, 2017, the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) confirmed a residential citrus tree was positive for Huanglongbing or (**HLB**), a **deadly** and **incurable** citrus plant disease. HLB is transmitted by the invasive insect Asian citrus psyllid, which is known to be in Riverside County. Local and state authorities acted quickly to remove the infected tree to prevent spread of the disease.

Representatives from the Riverside County Ag Commissioner Office, CDFA, California Citrus Mutual, UC Riverside, and City of Riverside will be providing updates, information, and resources at a community information session on
