This three-hour demonstration and informational meeting is for industry stakeholders, government officials, and other decision makers. Participants will observe how grinding and composting may be used as tools for animal mortality management.

Participants will have the opportunity to interact with compost subject matter experts that have been deployed during numerous catastrophic events and have been leaders in carcass management research and educational programs.

At the end of the program, participants will be better prepared to make educated decisions during a catastrophic animal mortality event and to transfer knowledge to producers, stakeholders, and colleagues to assist with the management of the mortalities.

The VIP field demonstration event will be separated from the composting training and will be running simultaneously while the trainees are in class training.

This event is being coordinated with the California Department of Food and Agriculture, UC Davis and Black Bear Agricultural Services. CDFA is coordinating this event with other local and state regulatory agencies. The event is sponsored by the USDA National Animal Disease Preparedness and Response Program (NADPRP).
